Resolution adopted and upon approval by Mayor assigned No. 2023-38 in the Official Book of Resolutions.

Council Member Callahan with a motion to approve a resolution ordering construction of the Install Runway and Taxiway Lighting Improvements Project at the Independence Municipal Airport and setting a public hearing for April 24, 2023, at 5:00 pm at City Hall on the proposed plans, specifications, form of contract, and estimated cost, second by Council Member Hanna. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Jensen, Callahan, Huston, Hanna, Moore, and O'Loughlin. Absent: Prusator.

Resolution adopted and upon approval by Mayor assigned No. 2023-39 in the Official Book of Resolutions.

2023 STREET REHABILIATTION PROJECT

Mayor Pro Tem O'Loughlin stated, pursuant to the agenda, he will now convene a public hearing for the proposed plans, specifications, form of contract and estimate of cost for the proposed 2023 Street Rehabilitation Project. City Clerk/Treasurer Lampe stated no written comments were received for this public hearing. Council Member Jensen asked about the comment received at a previous meeting. City Clerk/Treasurer Lampe stated that comment was related to the special assessment portion of the project. Mayor Pro Tem O'Loughlin closed the public hearing and stated City Clerk/Treasurer Lampe will note all comments in the record.

Council Member Huston with a motion to approve a resolution finally approving and confirming plans, specifications, form of contract and estimate of cost for the 2023 Street Rehabilitation Project, second by Council Member Jensen. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Callahan, Huston, Hanna, Moore, O'Loughlin, and Jensen. Absent: Prusator.

Resolution adopted and upon approval by Mayor assigned No. 2023-40 in the Official Book of Resolutions.

Mark Crawford, Crawford Engineering, reviewed the 4 bids received for the 2023 Street Rehabilitation Project. Council Member Moore asked for clarification on line 14 of the bid tabulation attachment as that amount seemed very low compared to the bids received. Mark Crawford explained how Crawford Engineering came up with that number based off of previous City projects. Council Member Jensen asked is the contractor held accountable for the costs put down in their bid. Mark explained how items may change as the plans are drafted in the early stages of the project and the contractor may have a different perspective on project items.

Council Member Moore with a motion to approve a resolution awarding the contract for the 2023 Street Rehabilitation Project to Eastern Iowa Excavating and Concrete LLC in the amount of \$335,804.83, second by Council Member Hanna. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Huston, Hanna, Moore, O'Loughlin, Jensen, and Callahan. Absent: Prusator.

Resolution adopted and upon approval by Mayor assigned No. 2023-41 in the Official Book of Resolutions.

OTHER BUSINESS

Council Member Callahan with a motion to approve Change Order #1 for the Police Department Remodel Project in the deduct amount of \$15,741.21, second by Council Member Hanna. Police Chief Niedert reviewed Change Order #1 and highlighted the significant cost savings of changing the number of doors installed with the security system. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Hanna, Moore, O'Loughlin, Jensen, Callahan, and Huston. Absent: Prusator.

Council Member Jensen with a motion to approve Change Order #2 for the Police Department Remodel Project in the deduct amount of \$15,476.49, second by Council Member Huston. Police Chief Niedert reviewed Change Order #2 items for Council. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Moore, O'Loughlin, Jensen, Callahan, Huston, and Hanna. Absent: Prusator.

Council Member Callahan with a motion to approve Change Order #7 for the Independence Covid Façade Project with no contract cost changes, second by Council Member Hanna. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: O'Loughlin, Jensen, Callahan, Huston, Hanna, and Moore. Absent: Prusator.

REPORTS

The following comments were heard from Council and Staff: Huston- Asked if in-house costs can be capitalized for projects for government accounting. Congratulations to the Iowa Women's Basketball Team. Moore- Asked about energy saving programs available in Iowa to help bring down energy expenses. Jensen- Spoke of personal experience of energy testing. Mentioned there was another train derailment in North Dakota. Saw that the National League of Cities is having a training on train safety and wondered if anyone from the City would be attending. Police- Energy savings were looked at for the remodel project, but it was hard to do as things weren't taken all the way down to the building's bones. City Manager- In-house costs could be capitalized for projects, but the contractor is generally paid when they show up to work on a project. Energy audits would be something the City could look into doing. The billboards on First Street West have been removed. City staff met with the insurance broker on the annual ICAP renewal to discuss possible premium reductions. ICAP has changed its policies based on recent disasters and therefore all participating City premiums will not be lowered. Independence Community Schools offered Cynthia Phillips the superintendent position. The City received the FAA grant for the Airport's lighting project and received congratulatory calls from the Iowa Senate and House of Representative members. He will be out of the office this Wednesday – Friday for the IMMI conference in Iowa City. Council Member Hanna, City Clerk/Treasurer Lampe, and he attended the Meals on Wheels event last Monday at Em's Coffee Company.
