Dustin Opatz, BerganKDV, presented the Fiscal Year 2022 preliminary audit report.

Brian Crawford, Crawford Engineering, spoke on the Highway 150 Reconstruction Project Phase 2, the 12th Street NE Storm Sewer Project, and the finalization of the Street Prioritization Program.

HEARINGS & ORDINANCES

Mayor Bleichner opened the public hearing for the Fiscal Year 2023 Budget Amendment #1 and did state that it was published in the November 30, 2022, edition of the Bulletin Journal. City Clerk/Treasurer Lampe shared this amendment will avoid one being done after May 31, 2023, and another amendment will be done in the Spring of 2023 to get additional items as needed. Mayor Bleichner closed the public hearing.

Council Member Prusator with a motion to approve the third and final reading of the ordinance providing for the vacation and conveyance of a portion of the 5th Street NE right-of-way, second by Council Member Jensen. Mayor Bleichner explained this is for the property that has a portion of the house in the right-of-way and there were other potential liability issues. A contract was entered into to convey the portion of the house in the right-of-way to the homeowner and to redo the lot lines. Mayor Bleichner did state there are other issues along the same street that will need to be addressed as those issues are brought forth to the City. Council Member Hanna asked if she had signed the agreement. Mayor Bleichner responded she did sign the agreement and has paid the agreed upon price. Council Member O'Loughlin asked if this was for eight feet and made mention of another property owner on that same street that wants a similar conveyance. Mayor Bleichner confirmed that it is for eight feet to be conveyed to the property owner and if there is another property owner in a similar situation, he/she needs to contact the City. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Huston, Hanna, Kurtz, Prusator, Jensen, and Callahan. Nays: O'Loughlin.

Ordinance adopted and upon approval by Mayor assigned No. 2022-571 in the Official Book of Ordinances.

Council Member Callahan with a motion to approve the first reading for the amendment to Code Section 69.06(4) Parking Regulations-Parking Prohibited, second by Council Member Hanna. Mayor Bleichner read the current ordinance as written and shared the purposed change after talking to the City Attorney's office. Council Member O'Loughlin made mention of 2nd Ave NE and 7th St NW that there will still be issues of vehicle bumpers covering the sidewalk when parking. Mayor Bleichner explained that this change will hopefully make people more aware of how they are parking and allow officers more direction on enforcing the ordinance. There are certain places that still may need exceptions. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Hanna, Kurtz, Prusator, O'Loughlin, Jensen, Callahan, and Huston. Council Member Jensen with a motion that the statutory rule requiring an ordinance to be considered and voted on for passage at two Council meetings prior to the meeting at which it is to be finally passed be suspended, second by Council Member Huston. Council Member Prusator stated that as much discussion that has been held on this topic, it would make sense to waive the second and third readings. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Kurtz, Prusator, O'Loughlin, Jensen, Callahan, Huston, and Hanna. Council Member Prusator with a motion to have this ordinance amendment for Code Section 69.06(4) Parking Regulations-Parking Prohibited be placed on its final passage for adoption pursuant to Iowa Code Section 380.3, second by Council Member Callahan. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Aves: Prusator, O'Loughlin, Jensen, Callahan, Huston, Hanna, and Kurtz.

Council Member Prusator with a motion to approve a resolution that re-appoints N. Whited to the Board of Adjustment, second by Council Member O'Loughlin. Mayor Bleichner reached out to Nate, and he is interested in continuing on the Board of Adjustment. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Callahan, Huston, Hanna, Kurtz, Prusator, O'Loughlin, and Jensen.

Resolution adopted and upon approval by Mayor assigned No. 2022-146 in the Official Book of Resolutions.

Council Member Prusator with a motion to approve a resolution for a necessary transfer transaction to place funds into a reserve fund account, second by Council Member Jensen. Mayor Bleichner said this transaction was based on BerganKDV's recommendation when performing the Fiscal Year 2022 audit. Resolution adopted and upon approval by Mayor assigned No. 2022-147 in the Official Book of Resolutions.

Mayor Bleichner stated Resolution 2022-126 was showing the City's support for a project grant that was in conjunction with two other communities. Council Member Hanna asked if payments would be made to Crawford or if that is included in the \$12,300. Mayor Bleichner said it is all included in the \$12,300. Resolution adopted and upon approval by Mayor assigned No. 2022-150 in the Official Book of Resolutions.

Council Member Hanna with a motion to approve a resolution that replaces and repeals Resolution 2022-141 that approved a homeowner/agency repair program project for 202 19th Ave NW Lot 6, second by Council Member O'Loughlin. It was found out that the furnace cost had gone up since the original quote was done. Resolution adopted and upon approval by Mayor assigned No. 2022-151 in the Official Book of Resolutions.
